Outstanding Canadian Women Doris Anderson (1921–2007)



Magazine editor and women's movement champion. Doris Anderson was a long-time editor of Chatelaine magazine and a newspaper columnist. Through the 1960s, Doris Anderson pushed for the creation of the Royal Commission on the Status of Women, which paved the way for huge advances in women's equality. She was responsible for women getting equality rights included in the Charter of Rights and Freedoms. She authored a number of books. including three novels and an autobiography — Rebel Daughter — and sat as the president of the National Action Committee on the Status of Women. Anderson was also an officer of the Order of Canada and a recipient of a Persons Case Award and several honorary degrees.
