### Canadian Women of Consequence Angelina Napolitano

(1882 - 1932)



The trial of Angelina Napolitano for the axe murder of her husband as he slept would turn a spotlight on domestic violence in turn-of-the-century Canada and on the plight of immigrant women in particular. It would expose deep biases in the court system, instigate an emotional debate on capital punishment and trigger a public outcry the likes of which has rarely been seen by Canadian judicial officials.

It would give suffragettes a glimpse of their collective power — and presage the determined fight that women would

wage for the next century to win equal rights in Canada's courtrooms, workplaces and legislatures.

The Napolitano were immigrants from Italy and lived in Sault Ste. Marie, ON. They had four children. The Napolitano marriage was abusive. Pietro had attacked his wife with a pocket knife in 1911, for which he was arrested and tried, but given a commuted sentence. Angelina was visibly scarred from the attack.

Pietro Napolitano had ordered his seven months pregnant wife to participate in prostitution to afford the family the money to buy a house. On Easter Sunday 16 April 1911, Angelina hit her sleeping husband about the head and neck with an axe, killing him.

She was the first woman in Canada to use the battered woman defence in a murder trial.

Napolitano was found guilty, and although the jury recommended clemency, she was sentenced to death. After an international outcry, however, the Canadian federal cabinet eventually commuted her sentence to life imprisonment. She served 11 years before being paroled.

In 2005, the story of Napolitano's marriage and dramatic trial was turned into an award-winning independent film, *Looking for Angelina*, which is used in many instances to assist children in opening up with counsellors to discuss parent al abuse situations.
